Dear SVP Partners and friends,

2018 marked yet another year of growth and impact for our SVP partnership and the nonprofit organizations we so proudly and gratefully serve. This impact took many forms, from helping to develop and execute a fundraising strategy for a fast growing Investee to recruiting navigators to walk alongside talented, disadvantaged students working to attain college admission. In 2018, SVP granted \$140,000 unrestricted dollars and countless volunteer hours in support of seven Charlotte nonprofits, our Investees.

We celebrated our final year with two Investees - Heart Math Tutoring and Common Wealth Charlotte - assured that both organizations are thriving and making a tremendous positive impact in our city. At the same time, we welcomed our newest Investee, The ROC, a nonprofit that recruits, educates and mentors high school students in Title I schools in Charlotte for Career and Technical Education and employment opportunities in the construction industry.

SEED20, our annual program to promote social innovation, highlighted 20 promising nonprofit leaders who shared their inspiring work and stories with an audience of 1000 in the Knight Theater at SEED20 OnStage.

Internally, we welcomed 15 new Partners into SVP and hired Katie Gauntner as our talented, part-time SVP Operations Manager. The SVP network grew to encompass 40 affiliates in eight countries with over 3400 Partners worldwide.

To all the SVP Partners who give so generously of yourselves in support of the mission and causes we hold dear, I thank you. You are the lifeblood of SVP and I look forward to continuing our work together in 2019.

PROFOUND GENTLEMEN


Profound Gentlemen (PG) builds communities of male educators of color who in turn offer a profound impact on boys of color in the school setting. The program utilizes trained, seasoned male educators of color (Impact Leaders) who serve as peer mentors for the new educators (Gentlemen). Impact Leaders guide Gentlemen on a professional development track to build their impact and leadership. PG currently supports nearly 70 male educators of color in Charlotte with the goal to support over 250 by 2021.

HEART MATH TUTORING

Heart Math Tutoring is a math intervention program that recruits and supports volunteers to work as tutors in high-poverty elementary schools. Heart provides a structured curriculum and on-site support to tutors, enabling volunteers to effectively support students with a commitment of one hour per week. To date, 98% of Heart students have met program growth goals.

FASHION & COMPASSION

Fashion & Compassion (F&C) empowers women overcoming poverty and injustice by providing part-time, transitional employment, soft work skills, and connection to further needed community resources. To support their work with vulnerable women, F&C raises funds through jewelry product sales while educating their customers about the issues and injustices facing women around the world. In 2018, F&C served 109 women in Charlotte and over 200 women internationally.

Common Wealth Charlotte (CWC) empowers Charlotte's low-wage workers to achieve financial independence through innovative education and financial products. CWC provides a well-developed training program for "trauma informed" financial education coupled with access to specially designed financial products. Over three years, CWC has provided financial education to over 7000 people, opened bank accounts for 1500 people, and issued 210 loans.

DIGI-BRIDGE

PLATESHARE

PlateShare engages the community to provide healthy food to those facing hunger by partnering with local restaurants to offer diners a platform to "bump up" their bills, and donate those funds to a local hunger relief agency. Restaurant patrons will have the opportunity to check a box on their regular tab for a small donation that is funneled to Loaves & Fishes, a local nonprofit that provides groceries to those in need. PlateShare will formally launch in 2019.

ourBRIDGE for KIDS

ourBRIDGE for KIDS supports the refugee and immigrant communities by offering a one-of-a kind enrichment program for newly arrived and first-generation American children. This afterschool program and community center have welcomed families and staff from over 40 different cultures. At the center, children learn to become better students and celebrate each other's cultures while being encouraged to show pride in who they are and where they come from.

GENONE

GenOne partners with talented, first-generation students from disadvantaged backgrounds, helping them successfully navigate to and through college. GenOne uses three supporting pillars to achieve its mission: college advising, exposure experiences, and Navigators who serve as mentors and trusted advocates. GenOne currently serves 75 Scholars ranging from 8th grade through junior year in college, and oversees 40 active Navigator/Scholar relationships.

INVESTEE IMPACT





PROFOUND GENTLEMEN

Across the country, they impacted over 360 teachers and school leaders, with over 70 Gentlemen in Charlotte. PG hosted over 12 professional, leadership, and personal development workshops and retreats to strengthen educators' purpose and practice. As a result of the support provided to each educator, 80% believed that PG helped them navigate the education profession, 41% received a leadership award in their schools, and 98% returned to their schools better prepared to impact students.

ourBRIDGE for KIDS

In 2018 they have seen unprecedented community involvement and support. Because of the many **new** volunteers who spend their afternoon at the ourBRIDGE center, students receive much more one-on-one literacy tutoring and homework help, and they have doubled the number of volunteer therapists who offer emotional support to the children. Several **new** foundations, corporations and generous individuals have joined ourBRIDGE's mission to support refugee and immigrant children so they can believe in a better future for themselves.





FASHION & COMPASSION

85% of the women they served will achieve their Empowerment Plan goals such as permanent employment or housing, emotional and/or financial stability, or improvement in English speaking skills in their project that works with immigrants and refugees. F&C added several new referral partners including the US District Court, MiraVie Home for single mothers, Our Sister's House, Renaissance West and West Blvd Ministry.



DIGI-BRIDGE

In 2018, they provided 2,525 K-8 scholars with STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts and mathematics) programming. In 2019, Ally Financial will join SVP as an investor in Digi-Bridge's work.



COMMON WEALTH CHARLOTTE

Since inception, CWC has made more than 200 loans. Opportunity Loans totaling in excess of \$170,000 to this low-wage earning population for emergency needs and upward mobility purposes, 110 in FYE 2018 alone.3,500 clients in Financial Empowerment Workshops 1,500 in volunteer-led credit report seminars. 3,000 advanced counseling hours, including 750 one-to-one sessions. 700+ previously unbanked clients with checking/ savings accounts.

HEART MATH TUTORING

In 2018, Heart volunteers collectively gave 17,396 hours of one-on-one instruction to Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools (CMS) students. 98% of 893 students met program growth goals on assessments correlated with growth on End of Grade tests. 89% of surveyed teachers reported that their Heart students grew in confidence/enthusiasm toward math. Across 17 schools, Heart students doubled the number of building block skills mastered, leaving for summer with 2,698 more skills than at the start of the year.



WELCOME TO SVP: THE ROC



THE ROC CHARLOTTE: Recruits, educates and mentors high school students in Charlotte, NC for Career and Technical Education

and employment opportunities in the construction industry. Juniors and seniors from selected Title 1 schools on the west side of Charlotte

will participate in the program.

The ROC is an accredited Youth Apprenticeship program which prepares students under the age of 18 for "entry" into full time construction work. The ROC Youth Apprenticeship program involves a combination of structured classroom and applied learning on the job (i.e. Work Based Learning) which ensures Youth Apprentices are obtaining marketable industry recognized skills as they progress.



SOCIAL VENTURE PARTNERS


A venture philanthropy organization providing a path for passionate people to collectively invest their money, skills and time in Charlotte's most promising nonprofits.

Many Charlotteans are seeking an avenue to give back to their community in a deeper way than simply writing a check. Moreover, they want to ensure their contributions have the greatest social impact while directed to the most effective nonprofits.

At the same time, many promising nonprofits suffer from lack of community exposure as well as the capacity to grow a healthy organization. They need resources to form a solid foundation that will sustain their operations and support their mission.







TO ADDRESS THESE NEEDS, SOCIAL VENTURE PARTNERS:



- has 155 Partners (members) who contribute \$5,000, 2,500, or \$1,000 per year to create a \$350,000 fund. These Partners are connected to nonprofits based on their specific interests and skills, allowing them to work with these organizations in a deep and meaningful way.
- provides unrestricted, multi-year investments to approximately seven nonprofits per year with the goal of strengthening their organizations and impact in the community. These nonprofits receive an SVP grant (approximately \$25,000/year for three years), but as importantly, they receive expertise and acumen from our Partner group.
- identifies, supports, and connects the community to issues and entrepreneurs in the Charlotte region through SEED20, SVP's annual program to promote social innovation.
- helps Partners become more strategic and effective donors by providing educational opportunities through exposure to and engagement with community leaders and issues.


